She continues to be affiliated with LIFE.

Naomi Labrum (B.A. in Disability Studies) is also a program supervisor for Victorian ABA Providers. After completing a Bachelor in Disability Studies, majoring in Psychology and Disability Services, Naomi has worked for the 8 years with children with Autism, specializing in Applied Behaviour Analysis. Naomi has been a consultant with Victorian ABA Providers since 1999 after completing a year and a half training course under Pam Roy (1 year) and LIFE in New Jersey (6 months).
